The Palmer Family

This Document notates the ancestral associations of the Palmer family with its many inter-relations of direct lineage by birth and marriage.

The detailed records begin with Sarah Maria Palmer and Samuel Palmer and cover the last two hundred years (1840-2010). The ancient lineage covers a period of some five hundred years (1470-1940).

For details of recent years, I am indebted to my cousins and their spouses, being those directly descended from our grandfather, Thomas (Tom) Palmer, born 1874.

For details of the last 200 years, we owe a huge debt of gratitude to our cousin in New Zealand, genealogist, Ronald Stretton. Ron is descended from Alice Palmer the sister of our grandfather Tom. She emigrated to New Zealand at the turn of the last century, becoming the Matriarch of that Branch of the family.

We come now to the 'skeleton in the cupboard' the 'mystery of the noble ancestor' and originator of the family wealth. Alluded to by our parents but never named. For solving this we have to thank the pioneering work done by cousin Clive Harrison followed by confirmation by great-cousin Joan Walters of Peterborough (now in her 90's).

I was talking to Joan on the telephone trying to unravel who was the son/daughter of X and Y, when I said that it was unfortunate that, with the death of the previous generation, we will now never know the identity of the mysterious 'noble ancestor'.

'Oh! That was my grandfather' she said and proceeded to give me the when, how and why, followed by other conversations, letters and photographs. A lovely lady, who just happened to be in the 'Last Chance Saloon'. All will be revealed in the following pages.

The solving of 'the noble ancestor' provided what genealogists call a 'pathway' in that the nobility have details of their ancestors going back to the year dot and recorded in the many standard works on ancient lineage. A selection has been reproduced here.

The Family Tree has been devised to show the linked descendants and their families. This will allow future generations to update their branch of the family, as and when. The loose pages also allow for ease of photocopy.

I trust you will find reading 'the tree' as interesting as I found researching, editing and compiling it.

Died: Aug 1922 at Paston, Peterborourgh, Northamptonshire.

Note - The 1851 Census of St Neots — Samuel states that the place of his birth was Willington, Bedfordshire, and that he was 26 years of age. This would have meant that he was born in 1825. He also states that his occupation was a carpenter. He and his wife Sarah, and son William (6) were living in the Hamlet of Staploe which is 4 miles West of Saint Neots in Northamptonshire. They had a house servant working for them at the time.

In the 8881 Census of Peterborough - Samuel states that the place of his birth was Kemptson in Bedfordshire, and that he was 49 years of age, this would have meant that he was born in 1832. He also states that his occupation was a carpenter. He, his wife Sarah and son Joseph J. were living at Monument Street, Peterborough. The 1891 Census of Peterborough - Samuel states that the place of his birth was Wilden in Bedfordshire and that he was 63 years of age. This would have meant that he was born in 1828. He gives his occupation as carpenter. He and his wife Sarah and Frank Palmer who is stated as being a relative were living at Swans Place, Peterborough. Frank Palmer was Samuel and Sarah Palmer's Grandson, disgraced son of Frank Palmer. (see later Frank Palmer)

granddaughter. "A nurseryman at Peterborough, his was a well-off family with
several servants" sourced from letters of Amanda Martin Palmer (nee Ashley)
and Mrs Winifred Noble. The Nurseries were still in existence during WWW2.

Died - 31 Jan 1933 at 33 Scotney Street, Peterborough and the house was willed
to Julia Palmer. In his Will he also left a considerable amount of money to his
sons and their oldest sons. Sourced from letters of Joan Walters, (nee Mansfield).

Note: Joseph & Emily had six children between 1882-1892, of which the names of the first five are (as yet) unknown. For surfers of the internet, the names of these children should be listed under Joseph Palmer in the 1881-1891 Census for Peterborough. The sixth child was called Josephine after her father and was born after his death.

Note 2; In the late 1970's, I (David Palmer) was visited at the Albany China Factory in Worcester, by two young ladies, who introduced themselves as distant Palmer cousins from America. They had been told by their U.S.A. family of their English relatives and of the Nurseries at Worcester. They had previously been to the Nurseries and met Uncle Claude and my parents Philip & Cecilia. In spite of having a long conversation with them over lunch, I am afraid that with the passage of time, I remember nothing. Sic Transit Gloria Mundi.

I have found no references of any descendants of William Edward Palmer emigrating to America. However, the 1890's were a time of mass emigration to America and it remains a possibility that one or more of Joseph's children took the chance of an assisted passage to build a new life in the United States.

father insisted he marry her. The child was Emmie Palmer

William Edward's family did not take to Isobel and Frank went off in disgrace. He and Isobel ran a Fruiterers business in Doncaster and had eight children. (Source: letters of Amanda. Martin Ashley, wife of

Edgar Palmer.)

He was the proprietor of Palmers Nurseries Ltd of Droitwich Road, Worcester and owner of Hotels - The Swan, Nr Teddington and at Tenbury Wells.

He was a talented restorer of old buildings, a racehorse owner and 'Patron of the Turf' He was known as 'Wicked William' due to his

agile business practices and his 'Eye for the Ladies'.

Cyril (Phil) still holds the Kings School athletics record for the 'Ketch Run' i.e. Edgar Tower, Worcester to the Ketch Inn at Clerkenleap and back, after some 83 years. (source: The Vigornian) A gifted student, he obtained entry into the Eastern Telegraph College

in London, lodging with his Pateman relatives.

The Eastern Telegraph maintained telegraph stations throughout the British Empire, many based at the various seats of Government. With a rapid turnover of Colonial Staff due to length of postings and tropical illness/death and the time it would take to send replacements from England to the far-flung outposts of the Empire, junior posts in the Colonial Service were often offered to Eastern Telegraph employees who were 'on the spot'. It was therefore considered a 'plumb job' with its possible entry into the Colonial Service.

At the end of his term at the London College, (he was hoping for a posting to India) his posting was to for three years in the Gold Coast (now Ghana) then known as "the White Man's Graveyard" due to less than a third surviving a three year posting there. This was prior to vaccinations, when tropical diseases, Typhoid, Yellow Fever, Beri Beri. Malaria etc were certain killers. Cyril refused this posting and as a result had to resign. His parents Tom & Grace Palmer had set great hopes on his potential 'social advancement' and as a result of his resignation from the Eastern Telegraph they quietly shunned him for the rest of his life. They did not attend his wedding and did not recognise him in their wills
